

Storybook Farm and Equine Rescue Foster Home Program

Most of the time, we are at or over capacity here at the rescue. Sadly, this means that we turn several horses away. In order to avoid this as much as possible, a needy horse can instead go to a foster home until we have room here or until they are adopted.

The rescue will make sure the horse comes with a current Coggins test and vaccinations. However, the foster home is responsible for feed and hay expenses while the horse is in their care. There is no time commitment, though it is preferable for the horse to stay at the same foster home until they are adopted to avoid stressing them with frequent moves.

You can let us know what kind of horse you'd be interested in fostering (young, old, mare, gelding, pony, full-sized horse, etc.) and we will keep your information on file should we encounter such a horse in need.

Foster homes will be screened just like adopted homes are screened and there will be a foster home contract. Safe fencing and adequate food/hay, and having your other horses up to date on vaccinations and Coggins will be the minimum requirements.

If you think you would be interested in providing a foster home for rescue horses, I would love to hear from you. Be sure to include what kind of horse you'd be able to foster and how many. Also include your address and, if possible, photos of your property.
